On 6-16-97 at approximately 1645 hours, I was contacted by Officer Robert Bennett. Officer Bennett contacted me reference myself being the on-call

detective on this particular day. Officer Bennett had stated to me that he needed my assistance in an investigation of an assault.

Officer Bennett advised me that he had a victim and a witness presently at the police department reference to an incident that occurred at the Motel 6 located at 1718 North Providence Road. He advised me that he had received the call at 1554 hours in reference to the female subject who was assaulted on the parking lot of the motel. He told me briefly that a male subject had called a female subject up in reference to a massage. When the female subject arrived, he indicated that he was a Columbia police officer and that he was going to arrest her for prostitution.

He went on to state that the female subject fought him off and ran to a telephone where she called her employer to come pick her up. When this occurred, she went back to her place of business where the crime was reported.

I then went to an interview room where a male subject identified as Barry Manthe was sitting. Manthe is the owner of the Needed Relief Massage Parlor. I advised Manthe that I was a detective investigating an incident involving one of his employees, identified as Tammy Sue Martin. I asked Manthe if he could tell me what he knew about the incident, at which time he stated to me that Martin works for him as a masseuse. He stated to me that he had received a call for an appointment at the Motel 6 located on North Providence. The first call came in with a different female; however, the male subject called back later and Martin received the authorization to go to the motel for the massage.

Martin left with a male subject, later identified as Daniel Kline. Kline was given a ride to the motel for Martin. Kline is not an employee of the massage parlor.

After they had left, Manthe stated that he received a call from the suspect in reference to where the massage girl was as she had not arrived. He told me that he received information from the suspect that he was in Room 223. After he hung up the phone, he then received a call from Martin who stated that she had forgotten the room number. He stated that he told her that he had just called back and gave the Room 223.

He advised at approximately 2:00 p.m., she arrived back and was very upset. He was advised by her that the suspect tried to assault her. She stated he stated he was a Columbia police undercover officer and that it was a sting. He stated that Tammy Sue Martin insisted on seeing a badge; however, the subject would not produce one. He stated at that time he thought the incident was strange and at that time he called the police department to verify or report the incident that had occurred at the motel.

After talking with Manthe, I then went to the other interview room where I spoke to Tammy Sue Martin. I advised her that I was the on-call detective assigned to the investigation of this case and asked her if she could tell me what had occurred.

Martin stated to me that she works for the massage parlor Needed Relief. She received an assignment to go to the Motel 6 in reference to a massage. She advised me that at first she did not receive the assignment, that another girl did. Then a female subject received a call from a male subject, the suspect, to arrange for a massage. He later called back and advised that he had gotten a room at the Motel 6 and to send someone over. At that time, she stated that she went to the Motel 6 in order to give a massage. She advised me that she thought the room was 230 something, however, she could not recall.

She went on to state that she rode over with a friend of hers who she identified as Daniel Kline. They drove through the parking lot and did not notice any one trying to flag them down in reference to the massage. At that time she paged her boss, Barry Manthe, back in order to obtain a room number. She advised me that the suspect had already called back in reference to where the female masseuse was. Manthe then provided her with the room number of 223.

She went back to the Motel 6 where she noted a male subject sitting on a stairwell between the Country Kitchen Restaurant and the motel. I asked her to give me a description of this subject; at which time she told me that he was a white male, approximately 5'10" tall, weighing approximately 200 pounds. She described his physique as a thick build, with short blonde hair. She also stated that his nose was very long and considered to almost touch his upper lip. She advised me that he was a clean shaven male and had no scars, birthmarks, or tattoos that were identifiable. She advised me that he was wearing blue jeans with a white and blue T-shirt and a ball cap.

As she approached the male, the male asked if she was the masseuse, at which time she stated that she was. At that time Kline drove away and she began to walk with him. They walked toward the southeast corner of the building when they started discussing prices. Martin stated that it was \$140 for her company and \$100 tip for her, for a total of \$240.

At that time the male subject asked how much it was for a hand job; at which time she stated that she did not know what he was talking about. She stated she told him that she was there only for a massage and that no sex would be initiated. He then stated to her that she was under arrest and that he was an undercover police officer for the Columbia Police Department. He then took out his handcuffs and tried to handcuff her. She told him that there was no way that he could do this as she had done nothing wrong. She told me that she then insisted on seeing some type of identification or badge; at which time the

suspect told her that he did not have to do this as he was undercover. At that time the suspect began to give Miranda Warnings to her; and again she insisted on seeing some kind of police vehicle, identification, or something to verify that the subject was, indeed, a police officer.

Again, the suspect stated that he did not have to do this and continued to try to put handcuffs on her. While this was occurring, Martin stated to me that she resisted to the best of her ability to keep from being handcuffed by the suspect. The suspect then physically pushed her up against a wall in order to try to put the handcuffs on her; at which time again she was able to stop him from doing so.

Again, the suspect stated he was a police officer and that this was a string and she was under arrest. She continued to resist, at which time the suspect stated to her that she was a very pretty lady and if she wanted to get out of this predicament, that all she would have to do was to give him sex. Again, Martin stated that she again wanted to see some kind of identification; and the suspect again refused to do so. She told me that she was able to get free of the suspect who was holding her against the wall; at which time she ran to the Texaco station located on North Providence. At that time she paged her boss and Kline came to pick her up.

I inquired about the time of the whole incident; at which time she stated it lasted no more than five minutes. I also inquired if there was any physical touching in her pubic area or breast area; at which time she stated this did not occur. She stated to me that he only asked for sex and did not touch her, with the exception of trying to handcuff her and put her against the wall.

I inquired if she had ever seen the subject before; at which time she stated that she had not. However, she told me that after she was picked up on the way back to the massage parlor, she did see a vehicle that had a subject who looked very similar to the subject who had tried to do this to her. She was able to give me a registration of 393-AZW. This checked to a 1983 Plymouth to Carol Freeman. She stated to me that the possible registration could be 393-ACW. This registration was not found in the Department of Revenue system.

I inquired if any one had seen any of this activity occurring to her while she was on the parking lot; at which time she stated to me that she was not sure. She advised me that she had a trespass warning for all of the property at Motel 6 and told me she tried to avoid being seen by any of the subjects who work at the motel. She did state to me that Daniel Kline, the subject who had dropped her off, had seen the suspect sitting on the wall and had also seen the suspect in the vehicle that she thought looked like

the man who tried to attack her.

After gathering this information, I then made contact with Daniel Kline. Kline was waiting in the lobby. I then escorted Kline back to an interview room where we had conversation.

Kline stated to me that he, indeed, gave Tammy Sue Martin a ride to the Motel 6 hotel. He advised me that he is not an employee of the business and only gave a ride as a friend. He advised me that when he did drop off Martin, he did recall a white male subject who seemed to be approximately 5'11", 200 pounds. He also advised me that he had very short hair and believed it to be blonde. The color was a very light complexion. He described him as wearing blue jeans and what appeared to be a white and blue T-shirt.

I asked about any other facial features; at which time he stated he was too far away to get a close look. He just described him as being of large build, wearing that physical description. He then stated to me that he believed that Martin and he possibly had seen the subject later, when they were going back to the Needed Relief Massage Parlor. He stated that when he looked at him, he did not think it was the suspect; however, Martin stated that she thought it could be.

Martin had told me that she believed it was a red vehicle; however, Kline stated it was a yellow vehicle. When I asked for the registration, he advised me that the registration was written down by Martin and that he did not have it.

I inquired if he had seen any assault occur before he left; at which time he stated he did not, or he would have stopped and helped Martin.

I asked if he had ever seen the suspect before; at which time he stated that he had not.

After gathering all this information, I made contact with the supervisor. Myself and Officer Bennett then went to Motel 6 where I made contact with front desk personnel, identified as Paul Passi. I advised Passi of the incident which I was investigating and asked if there was any information or details he could give me in reference to any incident on the parking lot or any of the rooms. He stated that he came on at 3:00 and was not aware of any. I advised about who was staying in Room 223 or any of the rooms in the 230 level; at which time he stated that he only had one person staying in a room close to this, which was Room 226. This subject was identified as Mike Jammson. He advised me that Jammson appeared to be a truck driver and has been at the motel for approximately six days.

I then went to Room 226 and met with Jammson and immediately noticed that he did not match the physical description of the suspect. I asked if he had been in his room; at which time he told me he had been there approximately two to three hours. However, it appeared that he had just been awakened. I asked if he had heard or seen anything in the last two to three hours; at which time he stated that he had not.

I gave a physical description of the subject who was described to me by Martin; at which time he stated that he had not seen anyone matching this description since he had been there.

Officer Bennett had received a key for Room 223; at which time the room was checked and it appeared that no one had been in it for quite some time. After this was done, I then made contact with the management of the Holiday Inn Motel which is directly south of the location where this incident occurred.

I talked with personnel at this location at which time they advised me that they had not seen anyone matching this physical description nor had had no complaints about anything in reference to any kind of an assault or any strange vehicles in the area.

At the time of this report, I will sent the information to the Persons Unit for possible follow up. I will do supplemental reports as needed.
