On 1/27/2017, I was contacted by Lieutenant Barb Buck, asking me to come to the Columbia Police Department to assist in a robbery/shooting investigation that occurred at 1125 Vandiver Drive. One of the subjects that I was asked to interview was an Anthony Wayne Hayes, Jr. Mr. Hayes had been located in a vehicle that two subjects had ran from. Mr. Hayes had stayed with the vehicle and was subsequently taken into custody by the Columbia Police Department police officers. Hayes was subsequently brought to the Columbia Police Department and placed in a holding cell at the police department until the detectives were able to talk to him. Detective John Hoff and I made contact with Mr. Hayes in Interview Room #2 at approximately 1:50 a.m.

I explained to Mr. Hayes why we were in contact with him and read him his miranda warning at approximately 1:56 a.m. Mr. Hayes stated he remembered his miranda warning as it was just read to him by patrol officers prior to Detective Hoff and I contacting him.

Mr. Hayes was asked what his evening consisted of and to give us a run down of what he had done prior to coming in contact with officers. Mr. Hayes stated that he and his wife were arguing and they were arguing inside and outside of the residence where they live on Lance Drive. At some point in time, they were inside and outside of the apartment when he got a call from his "partner." The "partner" asked him to come and drive for him, so he then walked from Lance Drive to Blue Ridge and Range Line Road. Hayes stated his "partner" was parked near 2904 Randge Line Rd in a vehicle with another individual and they were waiting on Mr. Hayes to come to start driving because he had a drivers license.

Mr. Hayes stated that it is not out of the ordinary for him to be called by friends to drive and that he did not find it out of the ordinary for these subjects to park approximately 2-3 miles away from where he was living and then called him and asked him to walk to their location, which was at the Colonial Village Trailer Court, on Range Line Road. Mr. Hayes did not find it out of the ordinary that two subjects would be able to get the vehicle they were in to that location but not any further to pick him up so that he could drive with them.

Mr. Hayes stated that once he got in the vehicle, he knew one of the two individuals and that was the individual that was in the front passenger seat. Hayes identified the subject he knew as "D man" or by his first name which was "Jeremy". Hayes stated he did not know his(D man) last name. Mr. Hayes said he did not know the other individual at all. Mr. Hayes stated he only knew "D man" because of seeing him on the street and he trusted him enough to drive a car for him. Mr.Hayes stated that he knew the vehicle belonged to a Jeffrey Tucker and assumed these gentlemen were family or some sort of relations to Jeffrey Tucker. Mr.Hayes said that they needed a ride over to the area of Quail Drive. Hayes said that he traveled down Vandiver towards Quail when two police vehicles went past him heading the other direction which would be

west and one of those vehicles turned around. Mr. Hayes said he was unaware that the police car had turned around until he was pulled over near Parker when the police lights came on, he then stopped. Mr. Hayes stated that the two subjects in the vehicle with him then exited the vehicle and ran away from the scene.

Mr. Hayes stated that the first patrol vehicle went past him after one of the runners and then a second patrol vehicle went past him after another one of the runners and went down Holly. Mr. Hayes stated he stayed with the vehicle, that he had plenty of opportunity to leave if he thought he would be in trouble for anything in the vehicle. Apparently, there were narcotics found in the vehicle. Mr. Hayes was asked about the possession of the narcotics in the vehicle. Hayes claimed he had no knowledge of the narcotics. Hayes was adamant with the fact that if he had known there were drugs in the car, he would not have stayed with the car, he would also have left the vehicle.

Mr. Hayes was asked if he would allow us access to his phone. Mr. Hayes stated that we could. Hayes said you could access the phone swiping the phone with his fingerprint. Apparently, that was not accurate as we could not gain access to the phone. Hayes did not know the security code, apparently. Mr. Hayes stated that the argument with his wife consisted of her getting in his phone and finding phone numbers or texts from another female. Mr. Hayes stated that when Mr. Hayes was asked how she was able to get in the phone if he did not know the code or have fingerprint access, he indicated it must have been left open after he had used it and she had had looked in it at that point in time. Detective Hoff asked Mr. Hayes about the phone and having the scanner app on it and that it was on when he was taken into custody. Mr. Hayes stated that he was worried about police being called on him for arguing with his wife by the neighbors calling, so he had it on just in case the police were coming to his residence. Hayes stated he did hear about the robbery on the scanner but could not give a time frame where he was in relation to the vehicle that he eventually drove.

Mr. Hayes also stated that the reason he turned down Parker was because he was either going to go see a female friend who lived down Northland or a male friend, named Bubba, who lived near Andy Drive. When it was pointed out to Mr. Hayes that was not a way to go towards Quail, Mr. Hayes advised that they were eventually going to Quail and since he was driving, he did not believe that the people in the car with him would mind.

Throughout this questioning of Mr. Hayes, he maintained ignorance of what the two gentlemen in his vehicle were doing and why they would run from the police and why they needed him to drive for him.

I recorded this interview on my digital recorder which will be placed onto a
